

Notice of historical re-enactment or ceremonial firearms event Arms Act 1983, Sections 29(2)(e), 30B(3), and 31

- 1. A person or organisation planning to hold a ceremonial or historical re-enactment event or production should use this form to advise Police of the proposed event.
- 2. As a matter of public safety, every production should be notified to a member of Police, including events where only non-prohibited firearms will be used. There must be a person (a society or organisation member) appointed as the supervising armourer for each production event who will assume overall responsibility for the safe use and control of the firearms involved.
 - Note: This person will need to be issued with a theatrical armourer (on-site supervision) endorsement by the addition of conditions to their endorsements under regulation 22A.
- 3. Police encourage applicants to use this form to include the use of any replica and airsoft firearms that will be used in the ceremonial or historical re-enactment event or production. Whilst this is not a legal requirement, it is good practice and allows the event to be logged with Police and reduces the risk of triggering public alarm.
- 4. Where the production involves pistols, prohibited firearms and magazines or restricted weapons, the supervising armourer must have a firearms licence endorsed under section 30(1)(c) and/or 30B(3). The endorsement(s) must specify that:
 - a. arms items may be handled at sites other than the licence holder's dwelling (firearms licence) or place of business (dealer's licence), as the circumstances may require
 - b. the carriage of firearms to theatrical performances is permitted.
- 5. The supervising armourer must be competent to supervise theatrical performances of the scale and type for which permission is sought.
- 6. The supervising armourer needs only to provide notice of a living history or ceremonial event once per event, even where it runs for several days.
- 7. The following conditions will be noted in all notice acknowledgement responses. That the supervising armourer will:
 - a. provide timely information to Police regarding any changes to location, dates of the production and types of arms items to be used in the living history event; and
 - b. give prior advice to the District Command and Communication Centre for each day that a production involving arms items, simulated gun fire and explosions which the public may see or hear is due to occur.
- 8. The member of Police reviewing that the notification is in order needs to be satisfied that:
 - a. the on-site supervising theatrical armourer holds the required endorsements upon their firearms licence, and has the appropriate on-site armourer conditions upon those endorsements issued under regulation <u>22A</u>, and
 - b. the theatrical organisation staging the event is an organisation described in the Arms Act 1983 s29(2)(e), and
 - c. the secure storage of arms items in transit to and from the event, as well as at the event location in respect of which the notice is given and approval is sought, will meet the requirements of regulations 19 and 28, and
 - d. the secure storage of blank ammunition (Hazard Class 1) in transit to and from the event, as well as at the event location in respect of which the notice is given and approval is sought will meet the safe working standards prescribed by WorkSafe NZ, and be compliant with New Zealand law pertaining to handling pyrotechnics, ammunition, propellant powder etc. including the:
 - i. Health and Safety at Work Act 2015;

- ii. Health and Safety at Work (General Risk and Workplace Management) Regulations 2016;
- iii. Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017;
- iv. Hazardous Substances (Fireworks) Regulations 2001;
- v. Outdoor pyrotechnic display compliance certificate.
